The IBM PC*jr* Memory Options are needed whenever you want to use additional memory beyond 128KB.

This package helps you:

• Run applications that need more than 128KB of memory.

Applications are game, education, and business programs you buy.

• Run applications that can use more memory for extra work space.

Some spread sheet and word processor applications do not need more than 128KB to run, but can use Memory Expansion as extra work space. This extra work space gives you room for big jobs and documents.

• Use part of the extra memory to imitate an additional diskette drive called Memory Disk.

The memory disk allows you to process information faster than a mechanical diskette drive.

What Is in This Booklet

This booklet tells you how to create two diskettes that allow you to run your applications with the PC*jr* Memory Options.

Part 1 - Memory Expansion describes how to:

- Backup your DOS diskette
- Create a DOS Backup With Memory Expansion diskette
- Add Memory Expansion to an application diskette
- Start applications using the diskettes you created.

Part 2 - Memory Disk describes how to:

- Backup your DOS diskette
- Create a DOS Backup With Memory Disk diskette
- Add Memory Disk to an application diskette
- Start applications using the diskettes you created.

Note: You must understand Memory Expansion before using Memory Disk.

Appendixes in the back include Error Conditions and using Memory Expansion with the IBM Cluster Program.

When to Use the Diskettes You Create

Use the DOS Backup With Memory Expansion diskette when your applications:

- Need more than 128KB of memory on the PC*jr* because of application specifications. Check the book that came with your application for memory requirements on the PC*jr*.
- Can run with more than 128KB of expanded memory. If memory size for the PC*jr* is not in your application book, try using the DOS Backup With Memory Expansion diskette.
- Can use more memory than 128KB because you're creating big spread sheets, documents, or files.
- Are running with the IBM *Cluster Program*. See Appendix B. "Using the IBM Cluster Program with Expanded Memory," for more information.

Use DOS Backup when your applications:

- Need the PC*jr* Basic Cartridge.
- Do not run with the DOS Backup With Memory Expansion because they were designed specifically for 128KB PC*jr*.

Use DOS Backup with Memory Disk diskette when your applications:

• Need a temporary second diskette drive setup in memory to store programs and files.

When Not to Use Either of the Diskettes You Create

Do not use the diskettes you create in the following cases:

• If you have self-starting applications, you do not have to use either of the diskettes.

Note: Self-starting means that you don't have to use your DOS diskette before starting the application.

• If you have applications that do not use the *IBM Disk Operating System*.

Saving the Booklet and Diskette

When you have finished using this booklet and PC*jr* Memory Options diskette, store them in the IBM PC*jr Guide to Operations*. Then you can use the instructions and diskette whenever you need to do another installation procedure.


Getting Ready

Preparing Your IBM PC*jr* **Diskettes for Use with Applications**

This section describes using PC*jr* to prepare your diskettes for use with applications.

DOS treats your single diskette drive as both drive A and drive B. You must switch diskettes each time DOS tells you to exchange diskettes until you see the "Copy complete" message.

Task # 1. Make DOS Backup

The first task you must do is make a copy of DOS. Follow the instructions below:

Hint: For this procedure, you can remember which diskette to insert if you remember:

"Source" = DOS original diskette that comes with your DOS book.

A *memory disk* is like having a temporary second diskette drive in the memory of your expanded IBM PC*jr*. You can use the memory disk to store programs and files.

The storage space on the memory disk is temporary. You will lose the data on the memory disk if any of the following happens:

lose power or power off,

press Ctrl-Alt-Del (System Reset),

insert a cartridge.

Using Drive C (Memory Disk)

The computer recognizes the memory disk as drive C. You can use DOS commands to copy files to the memory disk and to use the files that are stored there.

You can copy information from a diskette to the memory disk by inserting a diskette in drive A and copying the files to drive C. Also, you can save information that is on the memory disk by inserting a diskette in drive A and copying the files from drive C.

You must understand Memory Expansion before using Memory Disk.

This section of the book describes how to:

- Create a DOS Backup With Memory Disk diskette
- Start applications using the diskettes you created.

Appendix A. Error Conditions

This appendix contains the error conditions that can occur while using Memory Options.

While Installing Menu Options

Installation not successful...

Cause: This error condition occurs if there is not enough room on the diskette for the memory options files when performing the INSTALL procedure.

Action: Erase or transfer unneeded files to make room for the memory options files, and repeat the INSTALL procedure.

DOS Backup With Memory Expansion

If you receive any of the following conditions:

- unusual characters, or distortion on the screen
- hangs while starting
- seems to be in an infinite loop
- illegal function call (BASIC)
- syntax error-out of memory (BASIC).

Cause: The application was designed specifically for a 128KB PC*jr*.



Action: Restart the system using your DOS Backup diskette.

DOS Backup with Memory Disk

If you receive any of the following conditions:

- out of memory during startup of program
- hangs while starting
- seems to be in an infinite loop.

Cause: There is not enough memory for the application and Memory Disk at the same time.

Action: Decrease Memory Disk size or do not use a Memory Disk.

Appendix B. Using the IBM Cluster Program with Expanded Memory

This information applies to Version 1.00 of the IBM Cluster Program and is for the cluster manager.

Follow this procedure if one or more computers on the cluster is an IBM PCjr with expanded memory.

To use the expanded memory, you must reset the system after following one of these steps. Proceed to **Step 1** for local system resets or **Step 2** for remote system resets.

Step 1.

If you are preparing to do a local system reset, continue with this step:

- a. Follow the instructions in the *Cluster Program Introduction and Program Setup Guide*, then return to this book and continue with Step b.
- b. Use a text editor such as EDLIN or Personal Editor to add:

DEVICE=PCJRMEM.COM

as the first line in the CONFIG.SYS file on the local system reset diskette.

Note: Do *not* use the PC*jr* Install Program on your system reset diskette.

c. Copy the file PCJRMEM.COM from the PC*jr* Memory Options diskette to your local system reset diskette.

You can now do a local system reset from the PCjr station.

Step 2

If you are preparing to do a remote system reset from the station, continue with this step:

- a. List the files of your Cluster Program using the DOS **DIR** command.
- b. Look at the date of the files @#CLUSTR.COM and DC.COM. If the date is *later* than 12-30-83, go to Step c. If the date is 12-30-83, contact your IBM sales representative, IBM Product Center, or your authorized IBM dealer where you purchased the Cluster Program for the updated version of the files @#CLUSTR.COM and DC.COM, then proceed to Step c.
- c. Go to the *Cluster Program Disk Server Guide*. Follow the instructions up to "Configuring the Fixed Disk," then return to this book and continue with Step d.
- d. Get the diskette labeled "Remote System Reset Volume Creation."
- e. Use a text editor such as EDLIN or Personal Editor to add:

DEVICE=PCJRMEM.COM DEVICE=@#CLUSTR.COM

as the first and second line in the CONFIG.SYS file on the Remote System Reset Volume Creation diskette.



Note: Do *not* use the PC*jr* Install Program on your Remote System Reset Volume Creation diskette.

- f. Copy the file PCJRMEM.COM from the PC*jr* Memory Options diskette to your Remote System Reset Volume Creation diskette.
- g. Copy the updated file @#CLUSTR.COM to your Remote System Reset Volume Creation diskette.
- h. Copy the updated file DC.COM to your Disk Server Station System Files diskette and to your disk server station's fixed disk.
- i. Go back to the *Cluster Program Disk Server Guide* and continue at "Configuring the Fixed Disk."

These changes to the Remote System Reset Volume have no effect on the remote system reset of other types of IBM Personal Computers.


